1. <u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>

Mayor Sack called the meeting to order and invited the Council to join in the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. <u>Roll Call</u>

Mayor Sack asked the City Clerk to call the roll; a quorum was present to conduct official city business.

3. <u>General Announcements by the Council</u>

Mayor Sack announced that former Mayor Warren Ross had passed away and called for a moment of silence.

The Deer Summit originally announced for February 26th has been moved to February 25th prior to the regular Council meeting. Announcements were also made regarding other meetings, events and topics which may be of interest to residents.

Police Commissioner William Pease introduced two new members of the Police Department: Officers Brett Schlosser and Gabriel Caputo. Both officers made brief remarks.

4. Draft unapproved minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held January 28, 2015

Councilwoman Brett made a motion, seconded by Councilman McCartney and unanimously carried to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of the City Council held on January 28, 2015, as amended.

5. <u>Issues Update/Old Business</u>

<u>Snow</u> – There was a discussion of conditions of walkways as a result of the recent snow and cold weather. City Manager Culross said the City is attempting to assist in opening intersections for school crossings and walkways to schools, but the City is not clearing sidewalks that are the responsibility of the adjacent homeowners. Violation notices will be issued to those who have not cleared their walks. It was suggested that people call DPW if they have complaints about specific areas the City is responsible for that have not been cleared.

<u>Street Lights on Playland Parkway and Playland Access Road</u> – Mayor Sack reported that there is some disagreement as to whether the County or State is responsible for replacing the street lights that are out in the area, but he has asked the County to take care of it. Representatives from the County will be coming to look into the problem.

<u>Dogs in Rye Town Park</u> – Councilwoman Brett announced that people can now come into the Clerk's Office to obtain a permit to allow their dogs to be off-leash in a certain area of Rye Town Park from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

6. <u>Public Hearing to amend local law Chapter 176 "Energy Conservation" by amending</u> <u>Section §176-4, "Procedures for eligibility" to remove Subsection (D) which set a limit on</u> the total of payments collected by the City

Corporation Counsel Wilson said when the Council originally passed the local law, language had been added that imposed a ceiling of \$50,000 per year but in order to qualify for the program the City's law must be exactly the same as the State's model law. The proposed law amends that law to remove the additional language.

Councilman McCartney made a motion, seconded by Councilwoman Brett, and unanimously carried, to open the public hearing.

No one from the public wished to speak on the proposed local law.

Councilwoman Brett made a motion, seconded by Councilman McCartney and unanimously carried, to close the public hearing.

Councilwoman Brett made a motion, seconded by Councilwoman Killian, to adopt the following local law:

CITY OF RYE LOCAL LAW NO. 2 2015

A Local Law to amend Chapter 176, "Energy Conservation", by amending §176-4, "Procedures for eligibility", to remove Subsection (D) which set a limit on the total of payments collected by the City

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Rye as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 176 Energy Conservation

§ 176-4. Procedures for eligibility.

- A. Any property owner in the City may submit application to EIC on such forms as have been prepared by EIC and made available to property owners on the website of EIC and at the City Clerk's office.
- B. Every application submitted by a property owner shall be reviewed by EIC acting on behalf of the City, which shall make a positive or negative determination on such application based upon the criteria for making a financing enumerated in Subsection A of § 176-5 of this article. EIC may also request further information from the property owner where necessary to aid in its determination.
- C. If a positive determination on an application is made by EIC acting on behalf of the City, the property owner shall be deemed a qualified property owner and shall be eligible to participate in the Energize NY Benefit Financing Program in accordance with the procedure set forth under § **176-6** of this article, provided that in no case shall a property owner that has received funds from another municipal corporation for the acquisition, construction and installation of energy efficiency improvements and/or renewable energy systems be deemed a qualified property owner.

Section 2: This local law will take effect immediately on filing in the office of the Secretary of State.

Corporation Counsel Wilson said that the purpose of the local law is to amend Chapter 177 in order to make it consistent with Chapter 117 in connection with the creation of Historic Districts.

Councilwoman Brett made a motion, seconded by Mayor Sack, to adopt the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, the Council wishes to consider amending Chapter 177 "Taxation" of the Code of the City of Rye by amending §177-79 "definitions", to add a new definition for "Historic District" and amending the definition of "Landmark; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to call a public hearing on such proposed amendments to the law, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Rye as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to Section 20 of the Municipal Home Rule Law and the Charter of the City of Rye, New York, a public hearing will be held by the Council of said City on February 25, 2015 at 8:00 P.M. at City Hall, Boston Post Road, in said City, for the purpose of affording interested persons an opportunity to be heard concerning such proposed local law.

Section 2. Such notice of public hearing shall be in substantially the following form:

8. <u>Resolution for the City of Rye to participate in the Westchester County Consolidated</u> <u>Government Efficiency Plan for the municipalities and special districts within</u> <u>Westchester County</u>

City Manager Culross explained that in order for residents to be eligible for next year's tax freeze credit, the City must qualify by staying within the tax cap and must submit a Government Efficiency Plan that identifies efficiencies or shared services against the 2017, 2018 and 2019 budgets. This can be filed individually by the City or as part of a County plan. The risks associated with meeting the requirements are less by joining the County plan.

Councilwoman Killian made a motion, seconded by Councilwoman Brett, to adopt the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, the New York State Property Tax Freeze Legislation requires for the 2016 Budget Year that the taxing jurisdiction must maintain a freeze compliant budget for taxpayers to be eligible for a property tax rebate; and

WHEREAS, a local government efficiency plan must be approved by the State Director of Budget by the year 2016, which will save the taxing jurisdiction at least 1% of its 2014 property tax levy; and

WHEREAS, Westchester County is instituting a Consolidated Government Efficiency plan for the municipalities and special districts within Westchester County and;

WHEREAS, The City of Rye must send notice by the end of February of our intent to participate in the Consolidated Government Efficiency Plan; now therefore be it;

RESOLVED, that the City Manager is authorized to provide notice of the City's intent to participate with Westchester County in the Consolidated Government Efficiency Plan.

BACKGROUND: Council is asked to consider amendments to Chapter 165, "Signs" of the Rye City Code to allow for the display of banners at City of Rye ball fields and utility poles on City property.

CITY OF RYE LOCAL LAW NO. 2014

A local law to amend Chapter 165 "Signs" of the Code of the City of Rye by adding a new §165-10 to establish regulations for banners on City owned field fences and utility poles located on City property and to renumber the remaining section of the Chapter as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 165, Signs.

§ 165-10. Banners on City owned field fences and utility poles.

- A. Banners are permitted on City owned field fences upon approval from the Board of Architectural Review. All permits will be issued by the City Clerk's office and are seasonal and will be approved for the spring, summer and/or fall season. No banners shall be displayed during the winter season.
 - (1) When reviewing applications for the display of banners on field fences, the Board of Architectural Review shall take into consideration the size of the banner, the design, and the colors to ensure that such are in harmony are appropriate for the placement on the field fences.
 - (2) In no event shall banners on field fences be larger than 32 square feet.
 - (3) The Board of Architectural Review will consider applications for banners on a first come/first serve basis and has the authority to limit the number of banners at any given time depending on the availability of fence space.
 - (4) The Board of Architectural Review may consult with the Recreation Commission to determine whether a particular banner is consistent with the type of activities performed on a given field area.
 - (5) Applications for the spring season must be received on or before February 1, for the summer season by May 1, and the fall season by August 1.
 - (6) The City reserves discretion as to the exact placement of the banners on the field fences.
 - (7) All banners shall be hung with the advertisement facing inside the playing field area.
- **B.** Banners are permitted on City utility poles in the Central Business District upon receipt of a permit from the Board of Architectural Review.
 - (1) All banners to be placed on the utility poles shall be approximately 30" by 60".
 - (2) Only banners supporting or advertising not-for-profit organizations shall be considered by the Board of Architectural Review.
 - (3) When reviewing applications, the Board of Architectural Review shall take into consideration the design and colors of the banners to ensure that such are appropriate for display in the Central Business District.

- (4) The Board of Architectural Review will consider applications for banners on a first come/first serve basis.
- (5) The maximum permitted time for display is twenty-one (21) days.
- C. Once a permit is issued, the permittee is required to provide the banner(s) to the Department of Public Works for display. The City shall display and remove all banners.
- D. If an application for a banner is disapproved, the applicant may appeal the decision pursuant to Chapter 53, § 53-10 as set forth in § 165-2(D) of this Chapter.
- E. The permit fees shall be set annually by resolution of the City Council.

§ 165-101. Severability.

If any phrase, sentence, part, section, subsection, or other portion of this chapter or any application thereof to any person or circumstance is declared void, unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, then such word, phrase, sentence, part, section, subsection or other portion, or the proscribed application thereof, shall be severable, and the remaining provisions of this chapter, an all applications thereof, not having been declared void, unconstitutional or invalid, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 2: This local law will take effect immediately on filing in the office of the Secretary of State.

LOCAL LAW NO. 2014

A local law to amend Chapter 177 "Taxation" Article XII "Exemption for Historic Districts" Section 177-79 "Definitions" of the Code of the City of Rye by adding a new definition for "Historic District" and amending the definition of "Landmark" as follows:

Section 1: Chapter 177, Taxation. Article XII, Exemption for Historic Districts.

§ 177-79. Definitions.

CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS

A certificate issued by the Board of Architectural Review authorizing a material change of appearance of a Protected Site or Structure or within a **Preservation District**, as **defined in Chapter 117, or Historic District**, district subject to other applicable permit requirements.

HISTORIC DISTRICT

An area of the City of Rye delineated on the Zoning Map of the City which has been recommended by the Landmarks Advisory Committee to the City Council as "Historic" in that such area has added to the historical or architectural significance of the City, and which has been approved by the City Council.

LANDMARK

Any parcel or building or structure designated as a Protected Site or Structure not located in a Preservation District **or Historic District**, which nonetheless meets one or more of the criteria enumerated in § 117-5 and is designated as a Protected Site or Structure pursuant to § 117-5E.

Section 2: If any phrase, sentence, part, section, subsection, or other portion of this chapter or any application thereof to any person or circumstance is declared void, unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, then such word, phrase, sentence, part, section, subsection or other portion, or the proscribed application thereof, shall be severable, and the remaining provisions of this chapter, an all applications thereof, not having been declared void, unconstitutional or invalid, shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3: This local law will take effect immediately on filing in the office of the Secretary of State.
